$\Delta$  Total Income from 'RD' = €31.7 10<sup>9</sup>

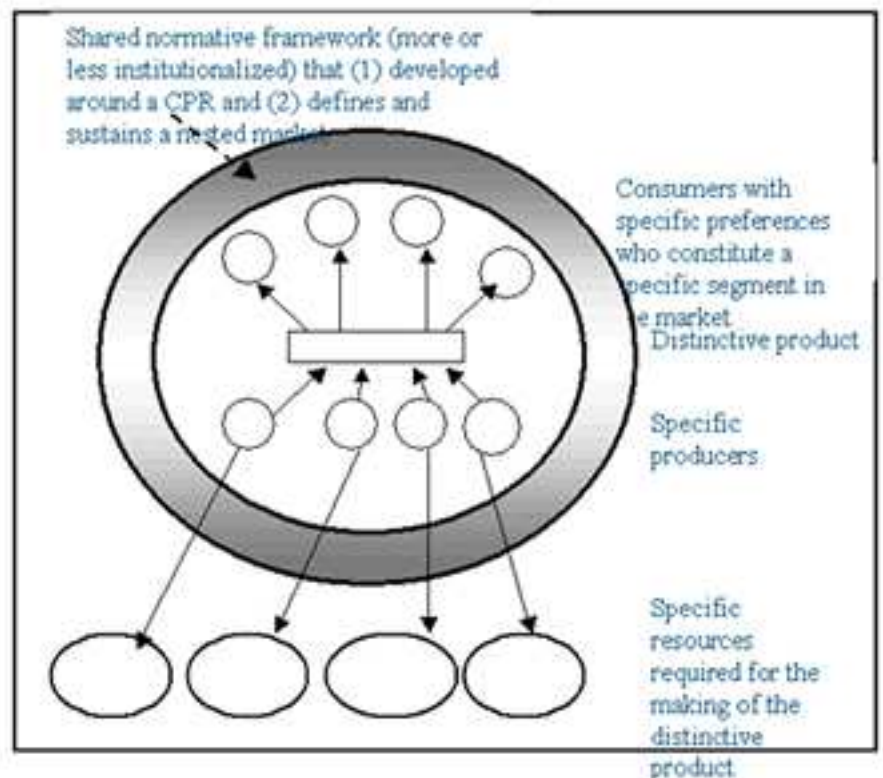

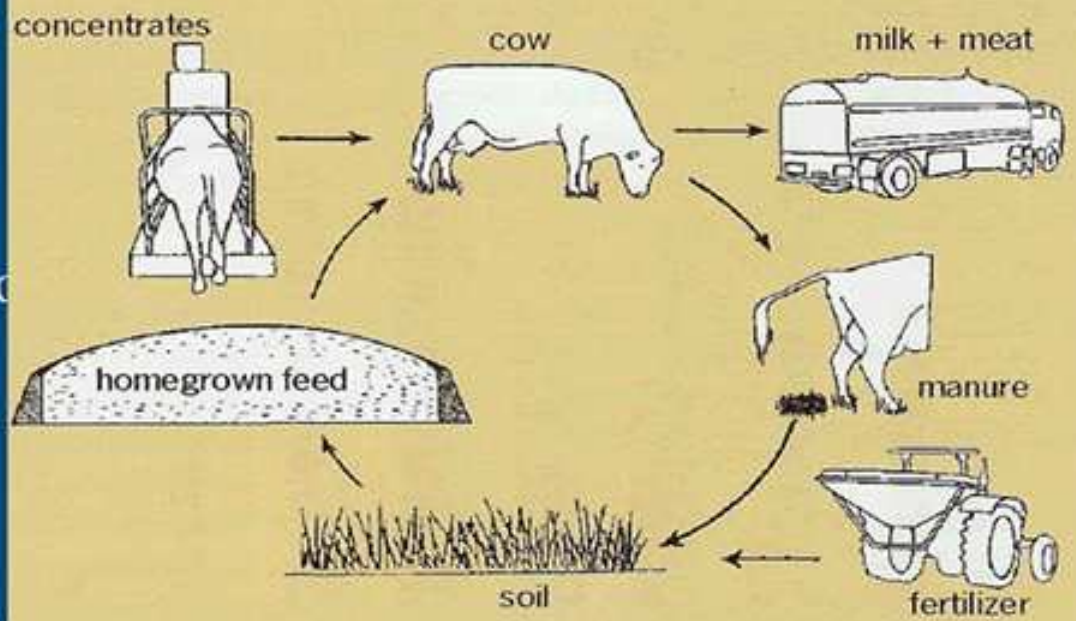
